The ICHP Amy Lodolce Mentorship Award

As most of you are aware, Amy Lodolce was a University of Illinois at Chicago College of Pharmacy faculty member who touched the lives of pharmacy students, residents, and colleagues through her passion for teaching and the profession of pharmacy. Throughout her time at the college, Amy oversaw the training of four PGY2 drug information pharmacy residents, all of whom are currently drug information faculty at various institutions. She worked directly with numerous PGY1 residents and APPE students during their drug information rotations. She also served as a formal mentor to her student advisees, and was the advisor of the Phi Delta Chi pharmacy fraternity for many years. As the Assistant Director of the Drug Information Group, Amy served as an informal mentor to other faculty and was quick to help new faculty become oriented and situated.

Amy approached being a leader and a mentor with an "open door" policy, and would selflessly pause her work to address others' needs. Students, residents, and faculty would ask her for guidance with career decisions and other professional concerns. Amy was respectful and nonjudgmental in her approach when assisting others whose goals and aspirations may have been different from her own. Her dedication was exemplary in that she worked tirelessly to provide residents and students with quality learning opportunities. She led and coached by example, consciously choosing behaviors that she hoped students and residents would emulate. As an active pharmacist member of ICHP, Amy placed emphasis on professional organization involvement and giving back to the profession. On August 31st, 2012, Amy passed away after a long illness, and this award has been created in her memory. Amy's dedication and generosity to the profession of pharmacy have positively shaped many pharmacists' careers, and the memory of her will continue to do so. Phi Delta Chi Continuing Education Fund

We hope to be able to provide these CE programs at no cost to those in attendance. As many of you are aware, our alumni association was able to sponsor many CE programs in the past with the help of major pharmaceutical companies and speakers from the College of Pharmacy. The ACPE accredited programs have become costly and "Big Pharma" sponsorship has become almost non-existent.

To kick off our cooperation with the University of Illinois, we will be joining forces with several other sponsors on 4-24-2014. The CE topic will be: **Assessing, Writing and Managing Parenteral Nutrition - A Case Study Approach** (more information in our next newsletter)
This program will be held live at the Chicago campus and via video at the Rockford campus.

At our last chapter meeting the members present discussed the possibilities of creating a **Phi Delta Chi Continuing Education Fund**. After meeting with the Senior Director of Development at the College of Pharmacy, we have decided to proceed with this endeavor. When fully endowed, the earnings generated would be available in the form of a grant to help defer the costs encountered when presenting a CE Program at the UIC College of Pharmacy. Compounding Corner

Use of a desiccant in compounding

When compounding a drug that is hygroscopic [drug takes up water from the atmosphere], one may need to add a compounding desiccant to make final the preparation. A recent request to compound betahistine 8 mg capsules using pure betahistine HCL powder would require such an additive. The drug will take up water from the atmosphere and become tacky while working with it to make a capsule formulation. Apparently, neither the 8 mg or 16 mg tablets are marketed in the United States for the treatment of Meniere's disease [pressure on the inner ear of unknown origin causing vertigo] and thus, pharmacy was asked to compound similar doses in a capsule formulation. Generally, microcrystalline cellulose, silica gel, or povidone K25 may be used as desiccants [there are others]. Always weigh out the desiccant first and triturate in a glass mortar and then quickly weigh out the drug and add it to the desiccant with trituration until homogeneous. Fill capsules to desired weights, package in a moisture proof container and store under 30°C.

Commercial tablets of betahistine are packaged in PVC plastic bubble packs with aluminum backings to prevent moisture from getting to the tablets. If one has the luxury of using commercial tablets to make capsules of lower dosages, the tableted formulations already contain desiccant materials and one should not have to add more. Still, I would advise using either cellulose or silica gel as the diluent powder to dilute the active drug. [Other drugs that are hygroscopic are: ephedrine sulfate, hydrastine HCl or sulfate, sodium phenobarbital, various salts of physostigmine.]
